SUPPORT PUBLIC SCHOOL (SPS)

SUPPORT Public School is the first affiliated school from CBSE, New Delhi at Mandu Ramgarh, Jharkhand. This school was established in 2018 by our honorable chairman Dr. Bhawani Shankar Gupta. Located in a remote village at Mandu, Ramgarh. SUPPORT Public School provides access to quality education for children from marginalized and underprivileged families. It serves as a lifeline for students from remote habitations who otherwise face barriers to learning. Classes from Nursery to X, Total enrollment-532 (Girls: 188, Boys: 344).

CBSE-based curriculum with play-way methods in early years; focus on holistic child development through academics, sports, cultural programs, and co-curricular activities like drawing, dance, debate, yoga, quiz, and traditional games.

Regular celebration of national days (Independence Day, Republic Day, Teachers' Day, Children's Day) with active participation of teachers, students, and community members. Special emphasis on inclusive education, ensuring equal opportunities irrespective of social or economic background. Facilities include safe drinking water, playground space, basic library resources, and dedicated teachers motivated to nurture children as futureready citizens. The school acts as a beacon of hope for the region by bridging educational gaps and empowering children with knowledge, skills, and confidence to thrive in the 21st century.

LIC SATHI EMPOWERING RURAL EDUCATION THROUGH DIGITAL CLASSROOM

Under the SATHI project, LIC HFL supported the installation of 32 Smart Classrooms across government schools in Mandu, Gola, and Dulmi blocks.

These interventions served as a turning point for over 1,550 students, fostering curiosity and enthusiasm through digital learning tools.

The project went beyond installation—it focused on strengthening institutional structures by training teachers, mobilizing School Management Committees, and involving parents. As a result, schools recorded a 15% rise in student attendance, improved learning outcomes, and a visible shift in classroom culture. Digital content brought lessons to life, making learning both interactive and inclusive.

This coordinated effort marked a district-wide digital transformation, equipping students with future-ready skills and reimagining rural education.

CASE STUDY

UMS UPPER KHAKHRA, RAMGARH – A MODEL OF SMART LEARNING

In the tribal village of Upper Khakhra, located in Ramgarh district, government school UMS Upper Khakhra was grappling with low student attendance, limited teacher availability, and minimal parental involvement. With support from LIC HFL under the SATHI project, a Smart Classroom was established, significantly transforming the teaching-learning process.

Following capacity-building workshops for the School Management Committee (SMC) and awareness sessions for parents and students, the school witnessed 100% student attendance and increased community ownership. Digital tools enhanced student engagement, reduced dropout rates, and filled teacher gaps. The initiative also emphasized health and hygiene (WASH), gender inclusion, and sustainability.

Today, the school stands as a successful example of digital inclusion in a remote region.



SOCIO - ECONOMIC & LIVELIHOOD DEVELOPMENT

HOLISTIC RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

SUPPORT, in collaboration with HDFC Bank, is implementing a three-year Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP) in (P0450) Chandwara block, Koderma district(2021-2024), & (P1010) Pathalgadda block, Chatra district (Ongoing), Jharkhand. Focused on 15 villages, the program prioritizes Water Resource Development, Soil Erosion Prevention, Agriculture, Training, Capacity Building, Awareness Campaigns, Institutional Development, Animal Husbandry, and Infrastructure.

Its aims to empower around 3000 marginalized women farmers by creating sustainable livelihoods. It emphasizes Natural Resource Management techniques, encourages new agricultural practices, advocates health and sanitation, and fosters income opportunities for women and youth. Livestock management is also integrated to enhance income generation and socio economic development.

- Improved access to basic healthcare at the village level.



CASE STUDY- CULTIVATING CHANGE THROUGH FARMER FIELD SCHOOL

Beneficiary: Champa Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal Location: Chaurahi Village, Chandwara Block, Koderma To address low farm productivity and limited access to modern practices, SUPPORT and HDFC Bank's Parivartan initiative introduced the Farmer Field School (FFS) model, benefiting over 150 farmers. Through training in advanced techniques like NADEP composting, mulching, and soilless nurseries, farmers increased cropping cycles from two to three annually and began earning ₹40,000–₹60,000 per cycle. The SHG now serves as a model in the region, promoting sustainable agriculture and inspiring others to adopt scientific methods.

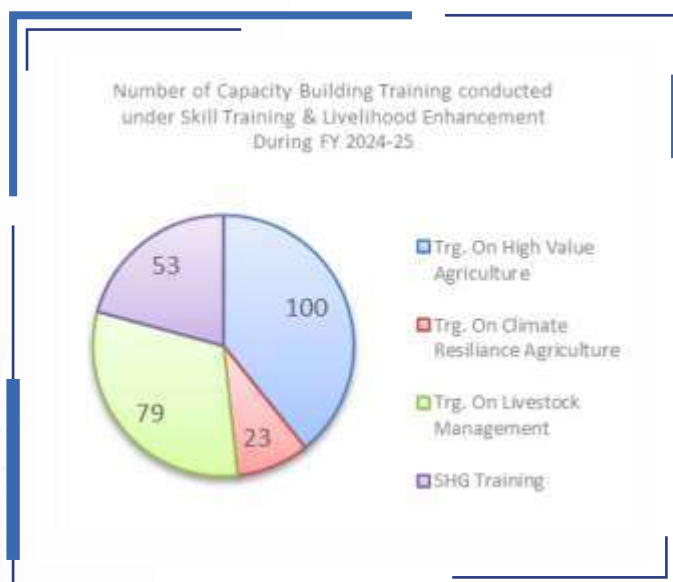

"Beneficiary: Laxmi Aajeevika Sakhi Manda Location- Village – Bhondo, Block–Chandwara, District–Koderma Laxmi Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal from Bhondo village, Chandwara block, Koderma, embraced goat rearing as a sustainable livelihood option through support from HDFC Bank's Parivartan-led HRDP, implemented by SUPPORT. Earlier, due to lack of proper shelter and exposure to cold and rain, goats suffered from diseases and animal attacks, leading to high mortality. Through the introduction of three Goat Mother Units (10+2 model of Black Bengal goats), along with training and improved practices, the group now manages 20 goats and earns an additional income of ₹1–2 lakh annually. This income has helped improve their children's education and overall family wellbeing. The initiative has positively impacted over 50–60 households, inspiring more women to participate in similar livelihood activities, thereby strengthening the rural economy and women's collective efforts.

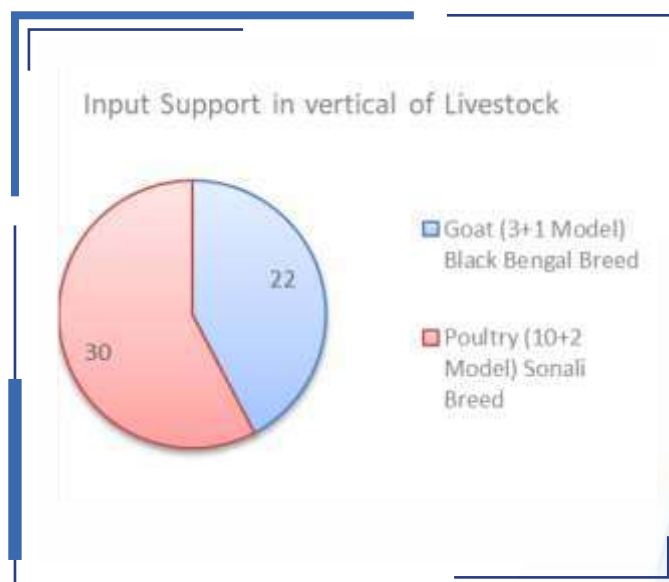

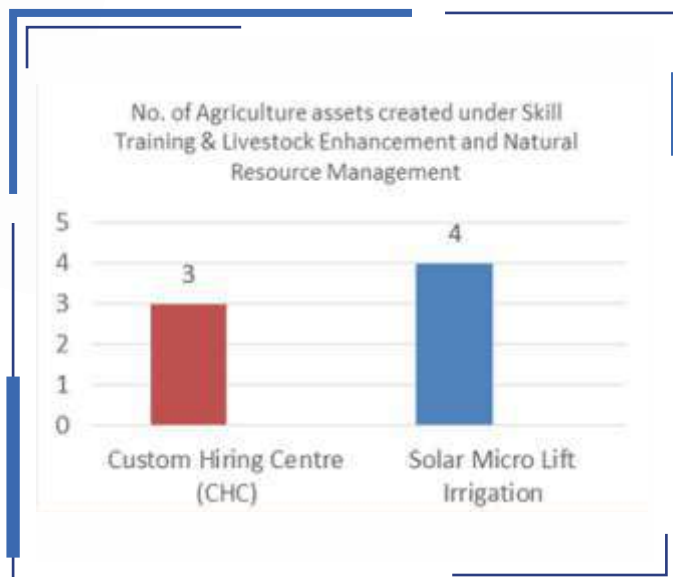
Capacity Building under Skills Training and Livelihood enhancement



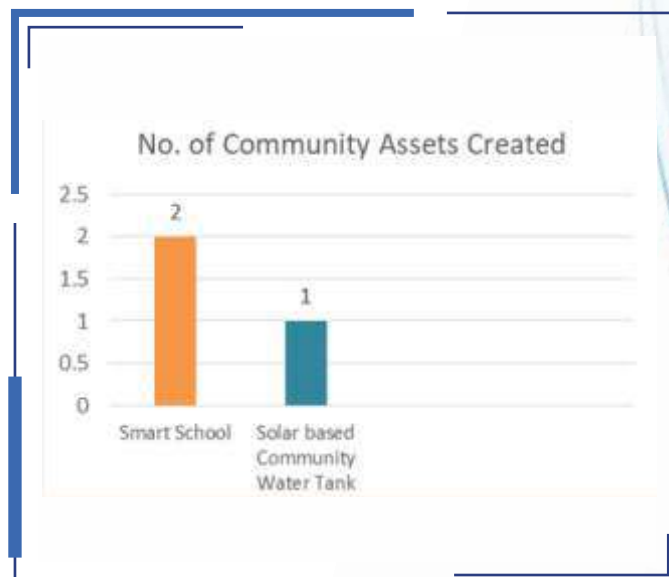
Input Support under Skills Training and Livelihood Enhancement (Input Support of Goatary and Poultry)

FOOD & NUTRITION SECURITY WITH INCOME ENHANCEMENT PROJECT (FNSIE)

- The project aims to achieve food and nutrition security and generate significant income for women farmers in the target areas. The project also aims to empower these women so they can make their own decisions regarding agriculture and other household matters.
- Coverage: The project is being implemented in the Mandu and Dadi Blocks of the Ramgarh and Hazaribagh districts of Jharkhand. The report does not specify the exact number of villages covered.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Training & Capacity Building – Trainings for staff, cadres, and farmers on nutrition, crops, and livestock.
- Agriculture – 2,435 nutrition gardens, modern crop techniques, and diverse crop cultivation.
- Livestock – 1,200 BYP and 659 goat vaccinations reducing animal mortality.
- Irrigation – 2 Solar Micro Lift Irrigation units installed for production clusters.
- Programmatic Changes – Introduced nano orchards and increased BYP herd size from 5 to 12 chicks

CASE STUDY: ADVANCING RURAL LIVELIHOODS

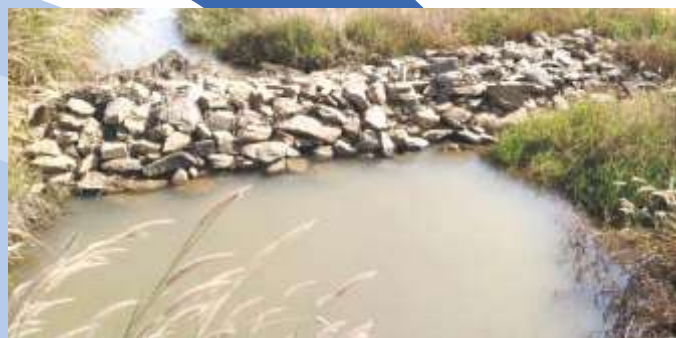
In Karidih, Mandu Block, severe water scarcity once restricted farming to just two households. In 2024, the project, with community participation, installed a Solar Lift Irrigation system benefiting 29 farmers. This intervention, coupled with regular training on improved agricultural practices, enabled farmers like Rajni Devi to diversify from seasonal paddy cultivation to year-round vegetable and pulse farming. Rajni earned ₹9,800 from pea and bean sales, while also producing potatoes, onions, brinjal, cauliflower, chilli, and tomatoes for household consumption. Inspired by her success, she developed a nano orchard with fruit trees and ridge gourd plants, a model later adopted by 18 other farmers.

In Rabodh, Dadi Block, 50 dismil of Dolly Devi's land remained underutilized due to lack of awareness of advanced farming techniques. After receiving hands-on training in multilayer vegetable cultivation, backyard poultry, and goat rearing, she established a trellis system for vegetable production, earning ₹50,000 from sales. Additionally, she generated ₹48,000 from poultry and ₹6,000 from goat sales, raising her annual income from ₹20,000 to ₹1,04,000. These cases illustrate how targeted infrastructure, skill-building, and diversified livelihood opportunities can transform rural economies, improve food security, and inspire community-wide adoption of sustainable practices.



JHARKHAND JAL CHHAJAN YOJANA (JJY)

- The Jharkhand Jal Chhajan Yojana (JJY) aims to create resilient rural communities by improving water resource management and promoting sustainable agriculture. The project focuses on increasing water availability through the construction of ponds and check dams and empowers local residents with training in water conservation and agricultural productivity.
- Enhancing groundwater levels and overall water resource management in rural Jharkhand.
- Promoting agricultural practices that are sustainable and water-efficient.
- Increasing water availability for irrigation and domestic use through the construction of ponds, check dams, and bunding systems.
- Empowering local communities with training programs on livelihood enhancement, agricultural productivity, and water conservation.
- Building resilient rural communities that can effectively manage their water resources for long-term sustainability and an improved quality of life.

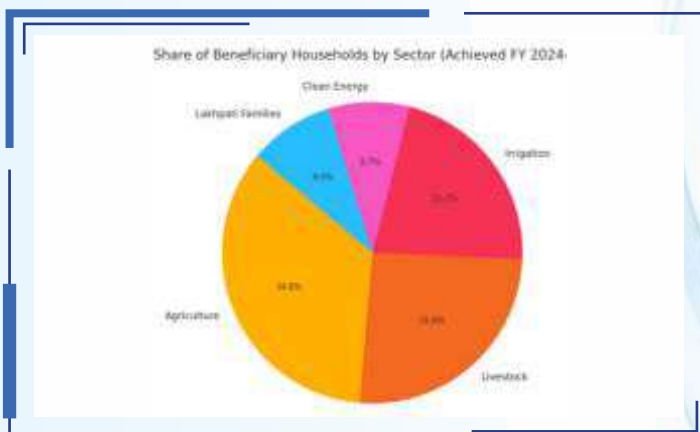


- The collaborative program between Tata Trusts and Cini successfully advanced climate-smart agriculture, diversified livelihoods, and women's economic empowerment across the Churchu and Dadi blocks.
- A total of 7,651 households benefited directly from the program's agricultural initiatives. This included the cultivation of high-value crops on 2,231 acres, with the adoption of modern technologies such as drip and mulching, protective cultivation, and comprehensive soil testing to improve yields and sustainability.
- The program by Tata Trusts and Cini advanced climate-smart agriculture, diversified livelihoods, and women's economic empowerment in Churchu and Dadi blocks.
- 7,651 households benefited from high-value crop cultivation on 2,231 acres, using technologies like drip and mulching.
- The Churchu Nari Urja FPC mobilized 822 shareholders, achieving a ₹3.59 crore turnover.
- Livestock development reached 5,644 households with deworming and vaccinations.
- 809 households were engaged in lac-based livelihoods.
- Water security improved through 7 seepage wells and drip irrigation on 8.2 acres.
- 1,912 households adopted clean energy, specifically solar irrigation.
- Key challenges included climate extremes, water scarcity, and market volatility.
- The future focus will be on drought-resistant crops, micro-irrigation, and stronger market linkages.

TDF WADI Project

- Building on Tribal Development Program, NABARD launched a nationwide initiative to replicate small orchards (1–2 acres) through the Tribal Development Fund (TDF).
- NABARD in collaboration with SUPPORT implemented a tribal development program for enhancing livelihoods through small orchards and integrating non-orchard activities like animal husbandry, sericulture, and NTFP for landless tribal families.
- The objective of this fund is to create replicable models of integrated development of tribal families on a participatory basis, through the adoption of sustainable income generating activities and to build & strengthen tribal institutions which enable mainstreaming of the communities by improving their socioeconomic status.



Raising Semialata Plantations for Lac Cultivation

Project Area: Churchu & Dari Blocks in Hazaribagh District, Jharkhand

Type of Beneficiaries: ST, Project Duration: 5 Years

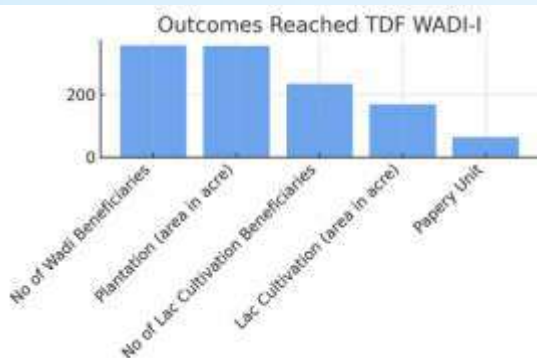
In FY2022, NABARD approved two projects in Jharkhand under its Tribal Development Fund (TDF) to establish semialata plantations on half-acre plots for lac insect cultivation. These projects aim to provide income and livelihood opportunities to 1,000 tribal families while also benefiting landless communities.

Unlike traditional lac cultivation that offers a seasonal and small-based livelihood that leverages the indigenous knowledge of tribal populations. The project adopted a 5 years project period, the time horizon seeks to strengthen the entire lac value chain from processing and value addition, enhanced market access (including exports), and reduce farmers' dependency on middlemen.

The initial funding covers plantation setup, related costs, and operational expenses for two years. This is being implemented based on a technical and agronomic collaboration with the Indian Institute of Natural Resins and Gum (IINRG) in Ranchi.

The projects are being implemented by SUPPORT in the Churchu and Dari blocks of Hazaribagh District

GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATIONS - TDF WADI I & II

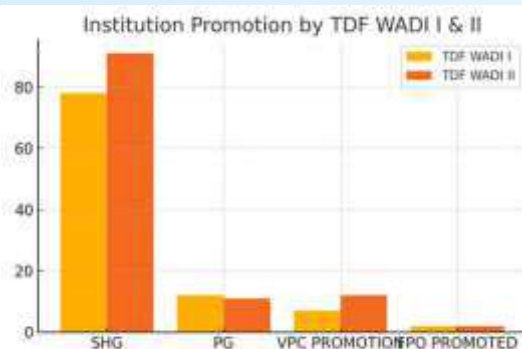
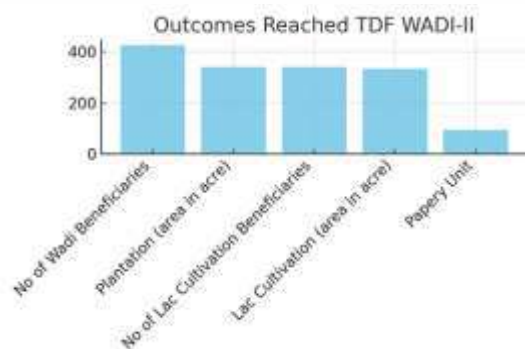


COMMON GROUND INITIATIVE

Grassroots catalysts drive action on livelihoods, infrastructure, and commons restoration, leading to visible changes such as better roads, water access, and increased incomes from agriculture and forest produce.

TRAININGS ON CAPACITY BUILDING

This initiative rejuvenates ecosystems and livelihoods in marginalized areas of Jharkhand by empowering Gram Panchayats to effectively use MGNREGA for watershed-based rejuvenation.

It aims to double incomes, enhance production, and restore ecology by merging wage entitlements with other schemes. Strengthening community and Gram Panchayat capabilities boosts climate resilience and fosters economic growth. The core strategy leverages MGNREGA, Jharkhand Government programs, and local resources for sustainable development.

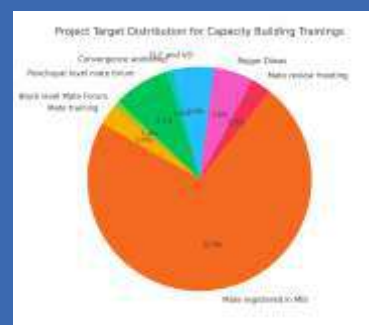

CASE STUDY

*Community-Led Planning through Commons Connect
Insights from FES, Odisha*

- Community-Led Planning through Commons Connect–Insights from FES, Odisha
- In Odisha, the Foundation for Ecological Security (FES) is driving inclusive natural resource management by empowering communities to take ownership of their commons—forests, water bodies, and pastures.
- A robust approach rooted in community consultation and scientific planning has been implemented in Nakchi Panchayat of Kishorenagar Block, Angul, using the Commons Connect platform.
- Trained Panchayat Resource Persons (PRPs) and Community Resource Persons (CRPs) facilitated participatory resource mapping across five villages. This process gave visibility to water resource distribution, especially highlighting caste-based access disparities, and sparked discussions on equity and sustainability.
- Through this dialogue, communities and FES collaboratively identified feasible interventions for water harvesting, recharge structures, and livelihood activities, aligning with MGNREGA provisions. Scientific data—such as rainfall, land slope, well depths, and evapotranspiration—sourced through CLART was used to determine the most suitable structures at the micro-watershed level.
- Once finalized, these interventions were digitally mapped to generate a Preliminary DPR (Detailed Project Report) via Commons Connect. Community validation ensured ground-level relevance, after which the final DPR was presented to the Sarpanch and PRI members. This spurred not only approval but proactive planning, as Panchayat leadership committed to integrating the DPR into the Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP).
- This initiative demonstrates how technology and grassroots participation can converge to ensure equitable, science-based, and community-owned planning, strengthening local institutions and promoting sustainable development of the commons.
